The British Library has just launched a brand new website – <u>Discovering Children's Books</u>. It's completely free to access and full of creative activities to do at home. Aimed at primary school children, teachers and book-lovers of all ages, the site explores the history and rich variety of children's literature, through treasures from the British Library, Seven Stories, Bodleian Libraries and the V & A.

Explore over 100 fascinating items, from one-of-a-kind manuscripts to illustrations and printed books. Go down the rabbit hole with Lewis Carroll's original manuscript of *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland*. Rifle through Roald Dahl's drafts, John Agard's poetry notebooks or sketches by Judith Kerr, Axel Scheffler and Liz Pichon.

For the writers and artists of the future, there's a gallery of free <u>activities</u> to spark children's creativity and inspire their own stories, poems, illustrations and more.
